In the 70th session of the General Assembly of the United Nations, presidents of sates and governments, United Nations officials, and representatives of civil society adopted the new sustainable development goals, in which UNESCO contributed.

Ensure inclusive and equitable quality education and promote lifelong learning opportunities for all

- Improving people's lives and achieving sustainable development is based on getting inclusive, equitable and quality education by all, as well as promoting lifelong learning opportunities for all. This is the 4th of the 17 goals of sustainable development to transform our world.
- The UAE is a role model in the region and the world due to its concern in education and investment in human. It is one of the first regional countries in smart education. The UAE has been keen to develop its education sector to match the highest international standards. It witnesses great development in terms of the establishment of public and private schools. Interest in education and investment and development in human have contributed to increasing the number of students in the country, along with the increase in the number of teachers in public and private schools. The UAE government has been keen to make education a priority on the budget, which is reflected in increasing the investment in public general, higher and university education in the UAE.
- Substantial progress has been made globally towards increasing access to education in all its stages, combined with the increase in enrollment rates, especially for women and girls. Reading and writing skills have been improved tremendously. However, there is a need to make more efforts to guarantee realizing leaps in achieving global targets set for education. For example, the world has achieved parity between girls and boys in primary education, but the number of countries that have managed to achieve that goal in all levels of education is still small.
- The number enrolled students in primary education in developing countries amounted to 90%. However, 58 million children remain out of school, and more than half of the children who are not in school live in sub-Saharan Africa. Furthermore, 50% of the children who are in primary school age and live in areas affected by conflicts do not attend school.
- There are 781 million adults and 126 million youth who are illiterate, +60% of them are women.
- One of the purposes of this development goal is to ensure that all girls, boys and youths get access to primary and secondary education, particularly free equitable and quality education. This would lead to the achievement of appropriate and effective educational outcomes by 2030. It would ensure that all girls and boys get access to good quality development and care in early childhood and pre-primary education, so that they would be ready for primary education by 2030.

Praise



evaluate and support them by all available means, on top of such means comes UNESCO-Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum Prize for Outstanding Practice and Performance in Enhancing the Effectiveness of Teachers.

She stressed the need for continued fruitful cooperation in the coming years, along with developing the Prize mechanisms and increasing its effectiveness in the development of education and teachers, especially in poor and developing communities and countries.

At the end of the ceremony, it was honored award winners, namely: the 'See Beyond Borders' Organization for 'Teach the Teacher' project, Cambodia which was launched in 2010 in order to develop primary school teachers' skills in rural areas.

The Organization continuously work in partnership with the local communities which to improve levels of education

through training teachers, enrolling children in schools, and development of a better environment for education.

Teacher the Teacher' has begun in 2010. It benefits around 324 teachers in the Cambodian countryside, and more than 10,000 children from the first to the third grade in 62 schools all over Cambodia.

Training teachers and supervisors in rural areas indirectly contributed to passing the annual test of mathematics by nearly 80% of the students with low academic achievement.

The second honoree is the University of Malaya – Administration of Mathematical and Educational Sciences in the Faculty of Education for 'Environmental Citizenship Education' project in 2005-2015, Malaysia. The project was launched to increase awareness in the environmental and sustainable issues by the educational system elements.

The University of Malaya is the first local university in Malaysia. It was founded in 1905 to meet the needs of higher education in the country, and to manage mathematical and educational sciences in the Faculty of Education at the University. It aims to provide a multi-disciplinary training and research in the field of teaching mathematics and science, health and physical education and teaching sciences of mathematics with information and communication technologies

The University of Malaya is the main researcher and one of the partners in the 2005-2015 Environmental Citizenship Program in Malaysia, where the project was designed through a codified process within the (LFA) system. This study was described as a significant practice towards achieving the goal of the project, which is to improve environmental citizenship in Malaysia.

The project is intended to address teachers, students, supervisors, instructors, and all their surrounding elements all over Malaysia. The results of Citizenship Education project range between rise and fall in each session. The highest level reached was 42.5% in 2011 and 2012. Although the result is going slowly, the project is moving steadily towards the increase.

Support & Encouragement

H. H. Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum, Deputy

Ruler of Dubai and UAE Minister of Finance launched the Prize for the first time in 2008 in order to support and encourage all those who work to enhance the performance and effectiveness of teachers all over the world. This goal is consistent with UNESCO visions and priorities.

Amounting to US \$ 300,000, the biennial Prize is awarded equally for three winners who have designed their projects to provide outstanding educational practice contributing



to improving the performance and effectiveness of teachers in various parts of the world.

381 participations have applied since the launch of the Prize, while the number increased 100% in the last two sessions.

As for the members of the international jury, they are nominated and selected by the Director-General of UNESCO. The jury is composed of 5 members representing all geographic regions of the world according to the International Classification.

UNESCO proclaimed 5 October to be World Teachers' Day in 1994, celebrating the great step made for teachers on 5 October 1966, when a special intergovernmental conference convened by UNESCO in Paris adopted the UNESCO/ILO Recommendation concerning the Status of Teachers, in cooperation with the ILO.

This recommendation sets forth the rights and responsibilities of teachers as well as international standards for their initial preparation and further education, recruitment, employment, teaching and learning conditions. Since its adoption, the Recommendation has been considered an important set of guidelines to promote teachers' status in the interest of quality education.

5 October also celebrates the adoption by the UN-ESCO General Conference in 1997 of the UNESCO Recommendation concerning the Status of Higher-**Education Teaching Personnel.**

Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum Award for Distinguished Academic Performance has entered into a memorandum of understanding (MoU) with the Arab League Educational, Cultural and Scientific Organization (ALECSO) on the sidelines of the honoring ceremony of the 4th session winners of UNESCO-Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum Prize for Outstanding Practice and Performance in Enhancing the Effectiveness of Teachers, at the headquarters of **UNESCO** in Paris, France.







The agreement was signed by Dr. Jamal Mohammed Al Muhairi, Vice Chairman of the Board of Trustees and the Secretary-General of Hamdan Award, and Dr. Muhammad Abdul Bari Qudsi Assistant Director-General of ALECSO.

Goals

The MoU aims at contributing to the achievement of the objectives and strategies of both institutions through sharing experiences and educational specialists including advisory personnel, as well as the joint cooperation in highlighting the importance of the education sector and its fundamental role in society, and strengthening education's status in developing countries.

The 3-year MoU will be a general framework for many future agreements targeting educational quality projects. Dr. Jamal Al Muhairi stated "the Award has tended to cover the geographical scope of the Arab world, based on the vision of His Highness Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum, Deputy Ruler of Dubai and UAE Minister of Finance, patron of Hamdan bin

Rashid Al Maktoum Award for Distinguished Academic Performance, and out of his national and patriotic duty, and of the faith of H. H. in the Arab minds and capabilities, along with their right of re-assuming their enlightening role and contributions to human civilization, and building on the firm belief of H. H. in education tool, as the driving force for development and progress for the advancement of the Arab nation, and achieving sustainable development in their respective countries, to obtain peace, stability and prosperity. In this quest, the Award counted on spreading the culture of educational excellence, taking care of talented and innovators, and providing expertise in support of some institutions that have adopted this direction."

New Shift

It is our mutual quest to support the efforts developing educational systems using the latest tools and technologies, in order to improve educational performance, which we deem the cornerstone to rescue the nation from failures, keep pace with global civilization and enable it to of keeping abreast of scientific developments and the tools of effect and addition," Al Muhairi elaborated.

Partnerships & Agreements

For his part, Dr. Abdullah Hamad Mohareb, Director-General of ALECSO said "we seek to conclude agreements and partnerships with various agencies and organizations because we believe that progress can be achieved only within the framework of joint cooperation, distribu-tion of responsibilities and success in the application of best agreed standards. All these factors are obvious in the performance of Hamdan bin Rashid Award for Distinguished Academic Performance, due to its profound experience in laying the foundations for the development of education and improving all the elements and components of the educational system within the UAE and abroad."

"This MoU will open wide doors in front of 22 Arab countries in the fields of education and improving it. Through this MoU, we are looking for marketing and intruding programs, initiatives and services of the Award, in addition to the joint organization of conferences, seminars, forums, scientific exhibitions, training programs and specialized events, not to mention exchanging publications, informative materials and research. Moreover, we aspire to exchange as much information, data and statistics as possible with the Award to assist in the development of our own plans and strategies. This will certainly be crystallized by the launch of joint initiatives and strategies in all issues relevant to teaching, culture, science and educational systems, he added.

Under the guidance of His Highness Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum, Deputy Ruler of Dubai and UAE Minister of Finance, patron of Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum Award for Distinguished Academic Performance, to keep pace with educational developments in the UAE, the Award announced developmental actions which affected a number of categories and their standards, as well as the value of material rewards, in the framework of supporting the government educational efforts towards turning the UAE society to be the society of sustainable knowledge which is a leader in the application of the most innovative educational practices.

Dr. Jamal Al Muhairi, Vice Chairman of the Board of Trustees, the Secretary-General of the Award, stated that the amendments included increase in financial allocations to 6 categories out of 12 categories, at percentages ranging from 14% to 50%.

He explained that the financial allocation to each of the Distinguished Student (UAE an GČC) and the Best Scientific Innovation, has become AED 30.000 instead of AED 20,000, up by 50%. In addition, the allocation to each the Best Applied Project and the Distinguished Family has become AED 40,000 instead of AED 35,000, increasing 14%; while the reward for Distinguished Teacher increased to AED 40,000 instead of AED 30,000. up by 33%, and the reward value for Distinguished University Student rose to AED 30,000 from AED 25,000, with 20% increase.

Dr. Al Muhairi added that the financial allocations to 5 categories remained unchanged; namely, Highly Distinguished GCC Teacher, with AED 60,000, Distinguished School and School Administration, AED 100,000, Arab Educational Research, AED 74,000, whereas AED 35,000 is allocated to Distinguished Educator, and AED 50,000 to Distinguished Educational Administration.

2 New Categories

He pointed out that two new categories were launched in the 19th cycle: Distinguished Educator, having 5 allocations, each at AED 35,000, and Distinguished Educational Administration, having 3 allocations, each at AED 50,000. Standards

Al Muhairi stated that the Award has developed the main standards for the two categories of Distinguished Educational Administration and Distinguished Educator; where the former category included 5 criteria: leadership, strategy, personnel, partnerships and and processes; resources, while the latter included performance and achievement. collaboration and professional commitment, professionalism and continuous improvement, initiative and creativity, participation and responsibility, and supervisory skills.

"The Best Educational Research has been removed from local competitions, whereas the category of Arab Research has remained unchanged, but the number of allocated prizes rose from 3 to 4. A special email address has been devoted to the category, and simple additions has been made to the content of the manual, including reformulation and clarification," he added.

Substantial Amendments

Al Muhairi clarified that there have been substantial amend-Education-Supments to porting Institutions Award, in light of the directives of H. H. the Award evolution and its spread, and keeping pace with local and educational variables to achieve quality education.

"The Award Board of Trustees, under the instruction of the Award administration, took the necessary measures to implement the directives of the Award patron. In response to this, the Educational Excellence Department in the Award took several actions, including studying the current status of all the categories, at both UAE and GCC levels, in public, private and university education, as well as the supporting bodies. A new vision for the Award categories was set, taking into account the historical evolution of the Award categories and their criteria, in addition to the gradual growth on the one hand, and the qualitative leap in excellence models in the UAE on the other hand, especially that it focuses on excellence and quality education programs to keep pace with the developments in the educational field, and reflects the sustainability of the Award leadership in excellence," Al Muhairi said.

Structuring

He explained that the new structure included the development of categories and widening the scope of participation, in order to keep abreast of local and educational variables and achieve quality education. Distinguished Educational Administration category, which represents institutional excellence, has been developed. The category covers the distinguished educational zone, central administration and any other groups interested in institutional excellence in education. The Distinguished Educator category has also been developed to cover the categories of Distinguished Mentor, Sociologist Psychologist and any other groups representing individual excellence.

4 Pillars

He pointed out that the idea of introducing and modifying awards is built on four pillars. First, previous experiences, as standards are built on the cumulative experiences of the Award, which spanned nearly two decades in the areas of designing, preparing and managing excellence standards, through which it could lead the educational field towards development, innovation and excellence. Secondly, sustainability, where standards have been introduced to support the march of excellence in the field of education in the UAE, to entrench the culture of educational performance at all levels, and to accommodate current and future developments in a way that contributes to the UAE's strategy achievement in the provision of quality education.

Third, originality and exclusivity, as the category standards in the Award were built on the best practices in excellence. The Award is the first that goes, locally and regionally, in line with the fourth generation (4G) of excellence pursued by the United Arab Emirates in providing its service and making its institutions distinguished. The 4G is regarded the first system designed to develop governmental per-formance in the UAE, taking into account differences and privacy in the nature of the agencies' work, and focuses on the results achieved by the body in accordance with the assigned tasks, beside its role in achieving the national agenda and stimulating it for future outlook, and keeping abreast of developments and the permanent development No change with financial allocations of 5 categories

of business systems to suit the requirements of future governments, which ensures a competitive advantage for the UAE and the adopting authority. This is what achieves the special identity of the Award and brings uniqueness on it.

The fourth pillar is integration. These awards are integrated with their counterparts of other awards in the general layout and evaluation mechanisms, despite the differences in the scope of application, the thing which achieves parallel growth in the educational institution and its members and the rest institutions.

Al Muhairi stressed that the Award standards keep pace with modernity and raise the performance level of the those who are ambitious to reach excellence, as they deem the continued development of the Award criteria contributes in promoting educational excellence, and dissemination of creativity and quality culture, in addition to highlighting the role of par-ties that support the culture of excellence.

He pointed out that Hamdan Award contributes to the development of educational process elements by pen-etrating creativity and the spirit of excellence among students and teachers in particular, and on the UAE level in general, to achieve its mission of reaching creativity potential wherever exists.

He added that the Award recently elevated at the local, regional, Arab and international levels in strict scientific style and methodology in the application of standards and principles by which categories and criteria succeeded. The Award remains in the development process to get to higher levels, which makes it one of the most accurate educational awards, where it turned into an accredited program for educational excellence that measures the level of educational institutions due to accurate scientific standards, adjusts their performance, helps them to achieve quality and believes that their positive impact are invaluable to the future generations.

19th session. The amendments included the development of standards, and increase of financial allocations for certain categories, as well as deleting, merging and creating new categories, in line with future trends and developments taking place in the UAE.

Dr. Al Suwaidi pointed out that the increase of financial allocations covered 6 categories in the Award out of 12. Two categories increased by 50%, another two by 14%, one by 33%, and the last one by 20%. He added that 5 categories remained unchanged in financial allocations, referring to the introduction of the two categories: Excellent Educator, and Excellent Educational Administration. Within the activities of the Seminar, Najeeb Al Ali, CEO of Expo 2020 Office, delivered a work paper entitled 'Expo 2020 agenda'. Two other key work papers were presented, wherein the speakers reviewed their experiences with excellence and the most prominent negative and positive effects in achieving creativity and quality.

Dr. Sajid Al Abdali, Kuwaiti lecturer and consultant, participated in a work paper enti-tled 'Reading and Discussion Groups - Educational and Cognitive Effects'. Shurouq Al Dhanhani, a winner of the Student and Distinguished Distinguished University Student categories, submitted the last paper under the title 'The Award Impact.'

At the conclusion of presentations, Dr. Jamal Al Muhairi honored the speakers who have helped to highlight the literary and scientific values in the Best Practices Seminar.

11th Adjudication Forum Introduces Latest Developments of Hamdan Award

Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum Award for Distinguished Academic Performance organized the 11th annual Adjudication Forum for the 19th session at Al Bustan Rotana Hotel, Dubai, in the presence of an elite of adjudicators and coordinators of the Award from the UAE educational zones and the GCC states. The forum included a meeting with Dr. Khalifa Al Suwaidi, General Coordinator of the Adjudication Committees, Member of the Board of Trustees, and Head of Hamdan-UNESCO Prize.





Dr. Al Suwaidi made a presentation covering the updates of the 19th session, the most important of which was the development of the key criteria both Distinguished Educational Administration and Distinguished Educator categories, where the first included 5 criteria; namely, leadership, strategy, workers, partnerships and resources, and processes; while the sec-ond included performance and achievement, collaboration and professional commitment, professionalism and continuous improvement, initiative and creativity, participation and responsibility, and supervisory skills.

Dr. Al Suwaidi highlighted removing the Best Educational Research category from local competitions, and keeping the category of Arab Research unchanged, noting that the number of allocated prizes rose from 3 to 4, while a special e-mail address has been devoted to the catego-

ry, and simple additions has been made to the content of the manual, including reformulation and clarification. Furthermore, Dr. Khalifa Al Suwaidi provided general guidance on adjudication.

250 Students Take 'Talented Discovery' Tests

New Horizons

Director of the Gifted Welfare Department stressed that this joint project with the Ministry of Education opens new horizons for talents in the Arab world, as it has modern tools for discovery and care. These tools take into account the value components and the best outcomes scientists and researchers in the world have achieved.

She added that the Award is counting on the potentials available in educational institutions and employing them in fostering this group

of students.

Discovery Portfolio for Talented Students project was launched in 2015, and will last until 2018. In its first stage, it has completed the tools of talented discovery for the grades from 4 to 6, where this stage comes complementary to the precedent.

Discovery Portfolio is the first integrated and comprehensive battery for spotting talents at the UAE level. It provides internationally accredited discovery tools, based on research and scientific basis and codified to align with the UAE environment, add to this, it is an integrated portfolio that includes all the stages of discovery approved scientifically and internationally.
